Kapingamarangi, Pohnpei - From October 6 to 18, 2019, AF's Kapingamarangi Coordinator Mr. Jaybee Joseph carried out collaborative work with the "European Union - North Pacific Ready for El Niño" (RENI) project coordinator Mr. Sean Kadannged during the implementation of RENI Water Security Project activities on Kapingamarangi. The three project sites on the island received the Rain Water Harvesting System. The sites were Kapingamarangi Elementary School, Kapingamarangi Island Dispensary and the local Protestant Church building. The rain harvesting system package comprised of installation of new tanks with first flush system and concrete foundations and repairing roof gutters. All the new tanks were installed with complete plumbing systems. Security fences for the water tanks were also constructed to ensure security and control and manage distribution of water during drought. One of the target site's roofs were change to avoid contamination from rust. Both the AF and RENI projects are both addressing water security in the islands as an impact of Climate Change. Collaborative and coordinating efforts between the two projects are paramount to reducing duplication of work and encourage complimenting each other.
